

Chinese language requirements in the B.Sc. double degree programmes

Each non-Chinese native speaking student in the B.Sc. double degree programme will participate in the HSK Chinese language test before graduation. Proficiency in the Chinese language is a requirement for graduation in the double degree programme. HEBUT and LUT will inform students about the test dates and procedures.

There are several ways to fulfill the graduation requirements regarding Chinese language skills.

- 1) Student passes the HSK 4 level test.
- 2) Student passes the HSK 3 level test and takes an additional 10-minutes internal speaking test, which is provided by HEBUT/LUT Chinese language teacher.
- 3) Student passes the HSK 2 level test and takes an additional 20-minutes internal speaking test, which is provided by HEBUT/LUT Chinese language teacher.
- 4) Student takes additional written and speaking test which are provided by HEBUT/LUT Chinese language teacher.

Students are supposed to reach the HSK 3 level after taking the Basic Chinese 1 and Basic Chinese 2 courses, which are in the curriculum. The content of the speaking tests corresponds the level which is achieved by taking the Basic Chinese 1 and 2 courses. In addition, students who are willing to reach HSK 4 level are encouraged to take two extra Chinese language courses named "Intermediated Chinese 1" and "Intermediated Chinese 2".
