Dear IEM newcomer,



In this role, I work alongside the Study Counsellors and the First Year Experience (FYE) team, and help students with questions related to courses, late enrollment, and Sisu problems!


I am also one of the people in charge of Tutoring, so don't be afraid to come talk with me and ask questions.


### Kide.app

Kide.app is a popular Finnish event and ticket platform used by student organizations and universities. You can use it to:

- Buy tickets easily using your phone

# How to get to Lahti?



#### From the airport (Helsinki)

Most international students arrive in Finland at the Helsinki-Vantaa airport. From the airport, you can make extensive use of Helsinki's public transport system HSL to explore the capital area. The easiest and most comfortable way to travel around Finland is by train.

#### To Lahti

To travel to Lahti from the airport, you can buy one ticket that covers the entire journey. The trip starts at Helsinki Airport Station, where you'll take commuter train P or I to Tikkurila Station. From there, you'll continue to Lahti on commuter train Z or an InterCity train.

You can buy tickets and check routes through the VR website, VR mobile app, R-kioski stores, or the Junalippu ticket machines at train stations.

Important: If you buy a student ticket without a valid student ID (or digital student card), you risk a €100 fine.



## Lanti IIII Transport around Lahti

Lahti's local bus system is called Lahden Seudun Liikenne (LSL). It operates across four zones (A–D), but most places you'll need are within zones A and B, for example city center or university.

Buses usually run from 5:00 AM to 11:00 PM, though there may be some changes on weekends or holidays. Ticket prices depend on how many zones you travel through and whether you have student status, which gives you a discount.

PS: You cannot pay with cash on the bus, you'll need to pay by card or buy a mobile/online ticket.

To activate student status for discounted fares:

- 1.Fill out the student status form (available on campus)
- 2.Bring the form to Palvelutori, on the 2nd floor of Trio Shopping Center
- 3. Order your LSL bus card online
- 4.Register your student status through the Waltti account management page

The Waltti travel card (physical bus card) can be ordered in two ways:

- Through the Waltti online shop, where you can either load value for single trips or buy a 30-day unlimited pass by zone. Note: there's a small service fee, which you can avoid by using the app instead.
- The Waltti app which offers the same features and is more convenient for most students.

Register as a student to get the student discounts.

Lahti's two main bus spots are:

- Matkakeskus the central transport station (next to the train station)
- **Kauppatori** the main market square

From either location, you can take bus 1K (Karjusaari), 1S (Soltti), or 13 (Niemi) to reach the M19 campus.

You can buy tickets in the Waltti app by linking your bank card. Cash is no longer accepted on buses. If you prefer, you can also buy your first ticket at an R-kioski when you arrive in Lahti.





#### **LAHO Events**

#### **Overalls**

Every student guild in Finland has its own pair of overalls with colors that make them identifiable. For example, our NAVY BLUE is known by almost every student in Finland for being the color of LUT IEM students.

You can customize vour overalls with patches and by changing sleeves with your friends from other guilds. #### **Excursions**

'Excursions' encompass a range of activities such as company visits, study trips, and research journeys. These excursions often comprise both official and informal segments, with evenings spent together after company visits being a common tradition. Additionally, some excursions are solely recreational in nature. Typically spanning one or more nights, these trips are a perfect chance to foster new friendships and broaden one's professional network.



#### **Annual Balls**

'Annual balls' are held to commemorate the birthdays of guilds, organizations or associations. These events adhere to a set of customary etiquette and typically follow a structured format. 




New to sitz parties? Don't worry—we've got you covered. While these academic dinner parties are all about fun, laughter, and singing, there are a few traditions and rules that keep things running smoothly. Follow these, and you'll fit right in!

#### **General Rules**

- Toastmasters' word is law! Always follow their instructions to keep the party on track.
- Stay seated during the program. You may only leave the table during official breaks, unless otherwise instructed.
- No talking during speeches or songs
   —let everyone be heard and keep the vibes respectful.
- You can request songs, and remember: every speech ends with a song request!

Dress codes for student events heavily rely on the nature of the event. Usually, the dress code is clearly stated in the event description or advertisement – this can be anything from student overalls to white-tie attire. It is heavily encouraged to follow the dress code for all events you attend. For some events the dress code is much stricter whereas for others you can let your imagination run wild!

#### **Themed dress-code**

For a lot of sitz parties and themed events there is an existing dress code that follows the theme of the event. These are the events where you can let your imagination roam and put together the best costume you can think of. It is encouraged to follow the themed dress codes since often the best dressed get a prize! It also makes joining the event much more fun when everyone is devoted to the theme and atmosphere.

#### **Overalls**

Often overalls are stated clearly in the dress code. If you're going to a themed event, the dress code description will, for example, say "Theme + Overalls". However, if you're ever unsure whether you're supposed to wear overalls, don't hesitate to ask a friend or reach out to the event coordinator!







#### **Smart-casual**

There are many versions to what might be considered as smart casual but it refers to a mix of a professional and a casual look. There is a more casual version which refers to company visits or other events of the same nature. A business casual look is good for these sorts of events. This means something similar to a button up paired with jeans or straight pants/ a skirt paired with a neat shirt. For a more professional smart casual outfit, a suit or a clean knee length dress are suitable options.

#### **Annual Balls**

When it comes to annual balls, the dress code is often the most strict since it is a white tie event. For men, the dress code is a dress suit, and for women, a full-length evening gown. The dress may be revealing but in that case, it is encouraged to wear a scarf or a bolero jacket to cover your shoulders for the beginning of the evening.







## TEEKKARI CULTURE

Teekkari is a proud title for engineering students in Finland. You'll officially earn it on May 1st—Wappu Day—after completing the Teekkari baptism.

Teekkaris wear their iconic white tassle cap with pride, and you'll spot plenty of older students rocking theirs during the orientation days. Soon, it'll be your turn too!





#### **Fresher Baptism**

A very important event held after the Fresher weeks, the Fresher Baptism is held to promote mere students to Freshers, A.K.A. Freshmen! During it you walk into Lahti's Vesijärvi, recite the Fresher Oath, and get baptized by your Fresher Captain.

#### Teekari Baptism

Like the Fresher Baptism, the Teekkari Baptism is another CRUCIAL event held during your first year, though this time, during Wappu Eve. After sliding down a metal slide into Vesijärvi Freshers become Teekkaris A.K.A. proper engineering students, and at midnight all new Teekkaris are allowed to put on their Teekkari Caps for the first time!



## TEEKKARI CULTURE Kyykkä

Kyykkä is an old Karelian village game that has been played in various parts of Karelia and its surrounding areas since the 1800s. After the 1950s, the game is practiced especially in academic contexts at universities, where the game is played several times during studies. In University contexts there are multiple national contests to take part in during a year. PoWi Cup being one of them is held in Lappeenranta where LUT also has its biggest campus.

#### **Rules in a Nutshell**

While the rules might sometimes slightly differ depending on who you ask from, the game itself is pretty simple. Traditionally, the game is a scrimmage between the teams. It requires a playing field with two demarcated areas at a distance of ten meters from each other. Wooden game pieces 'Kyykät' are placed in a row at the front borders of the squares, always two on top of each other. The game is played in such a way that each team tries to use throwing sticks 'Kartut' to get the opposite side's Kyykät out of the square over the side or back boundaries.

### **HCP**

#### **Harrasment Contact Person**

A harassment contact person is a support person who you can turn to if you feel like you've been harassed by another student or staff member.

Harassment contact people will support and guided you through harassment cases. They will help you find the right person to tell about distress and guide you on where to find more help, if needed. They advise and support students who have encountered harassment, assault, discrimination, bullying or any other unequal treatment.

Harassment contact persons are not official authorities (e.g. police), but they are trained for their roles. You can be in contact with them even if you are not the subject of harassment, but have seen harassment or want to talk about harassment prevention.

Harassment contact persons will not take any further action without the consent of the person concerned. All discussions with harassment contact people are strictly confidential as they are bound by a confidentiality obligation.
