ENKLAAVI'S ACTIVE WORK

In addition to Enklaavi's board, the core of its activities revolves around eight committees, each responsible for a specific area of the association's operations. Each committee is led by one or more board members, and new members are recruited annually after the board changes.

If you feel that low-threshold student involvement is your thing, joining a committee is a fantastic opportunity to develop new skills and gain experience – but most importantly, to form new friendships.

ADVOCACY IN ENKLAAVI

What is advocacy?

Study advocacy or education policy is the collaborative effort of multiple parties to ensure smooth and issue free studies. Some examples education policy oversees are any issues regarding courses as a whole or issues a single student is having are taken care of, and the quality of teaching overall is maintained and improved.

Head of Academic Affairs

The Head of Academic Affairs of Enklaavi is a board member and their responsibility is to take care of any issues related to business school studies and most importantly to advocate for all of you. If any business student has issues with their studies you are warmly welcomed to contact the current head of academic affairs even if the issue may seem mundane. If a more complex issue were to arise, the head of academic affairs is able to escalate it within the business school or within other guilds if the issue isn't directly related to business studies.

The Advocacy network

Every guild's board has their own person responsible for study advocacy. Together with LTKY's study advocacy representatives we meet regularly to discuss ongoing issues within our guilds. There is also a network between all business studies' guilds in Finland for us to discuss business studies related topics. We meet a few times throughout the year, often hosted by our labour union Suomen Ekonomit.

INFORMATION ABOUT HARASSMENT AND HARASSMENT CONTACT PERSONS (HCPS)

What is considered harassment?

Harassment can take many forms, from bullying, aggressive language, sexual advances or physical altercations. People experience harassment differently, so in general be mindful of your words and actions.

What to do if you experience harassment?

If you experience harassment in a student event or somewhere in the student life, you can always contact LTKY's designated Lahti HCPs, but usually every event has their own from the organizing guild of club, and their contact info can be found from the event info.

When you contact a HCP, the conversation you have is confidential and you are the one who decides how you want to proceed with the situation. The main role of the HCP is to be an impartial listener for you and then mediate the situation if you wish so.

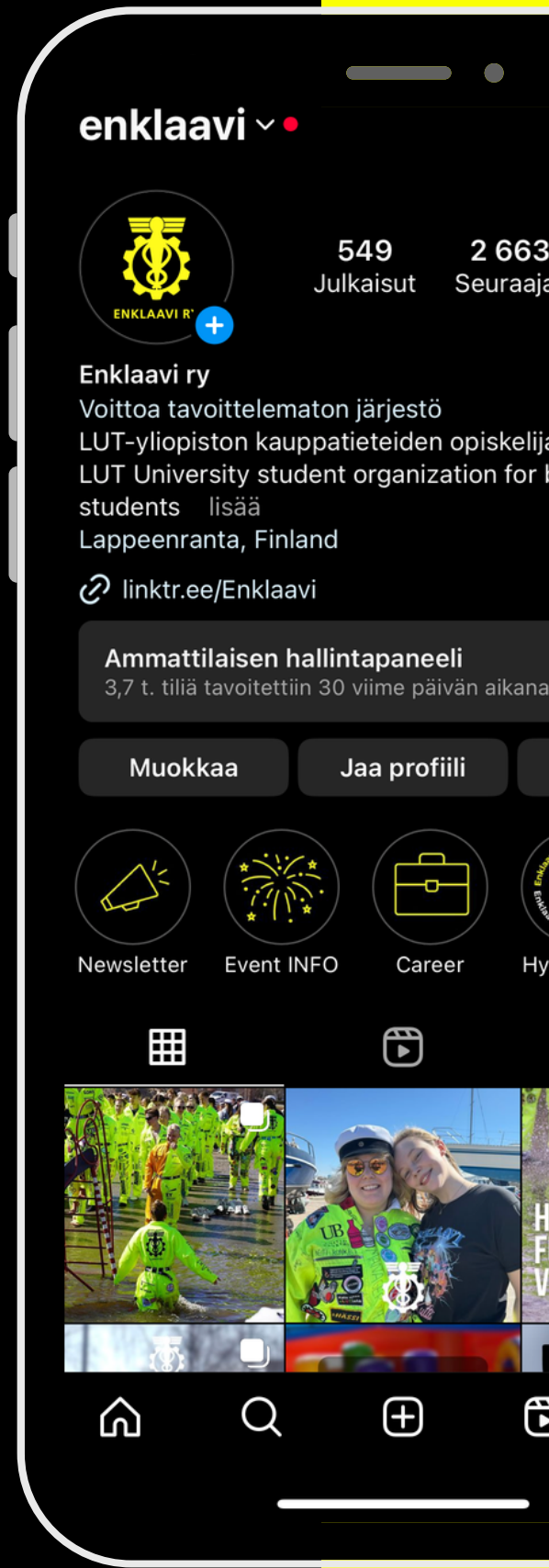

Additionally, you can spend time at Enklaavi's guild room. As proof of your membership, you'll receive an electronic membership card from both Suomen Ekonomit and Enklaavi.

MOBILE PAY

At many student events, the only accepted payment methods are MobilePay or, alternatively, cash – so make sure to download MobilePay!



TELEGRAM

Telegram is the most common channel for communications in student life. You will have multiple groups to join: guild chat, NESU chat, club chats, campus chats etc.



TUUDO

Tuudo is a personal helper for students' academic life. By using a single app, students can view their class schedule, register for courses, navigate the campus, visit the library, and check the menus of student cafeterias.

KUUTTI

[Enklaavi's fresher] ; KUUTTI

An Enklaavi fresher is a first-year student at LUT University's Business School. The term is used during the fresher weeks for all first-year students of Enklaavi before they are officially inducted as kylterifreshers during the promotion ceremony. Kuutti is a Finnish term for a seal pup: seals (norppa) are found in Lake Saimaa.

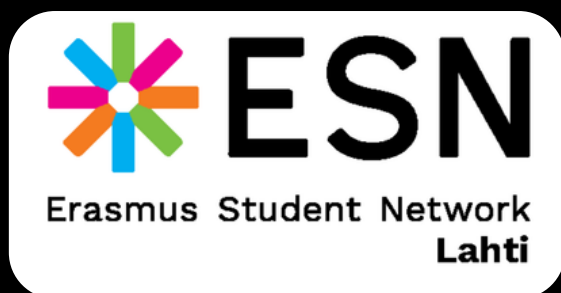

DICTIONARY

- AALEF:** LTKY's (the student union) own company includes for example the restaurant YOLO located on the university campus, as well as Meidän Kioski, in the university lobby.
- Academic quarter:** The "academic quarter" is a tradition used in universities, according to which lectures, for example, start 15 minutes past the hour. If it is not specifically stated that a lecture begins on the hour, you can assume that the academic quarter is in effect.
- Aether:** Former Student Association (guild) for all of the programs in Lahti held by LUT. This association is dissolved as of May 2024, and the resulting guilds are the current guilds of Lahti; Fuusio, Kapital and SoSA.
- Appros:** A student event where the goal is to visit local bars, restaurants, or similar venues and collect stamps, which eventually earn you an overall badge (engl. pub crawl). Appros can also mean any kind of event where you go from one place to another, e.g. to people's apartments
- eLUT:** An important online information bank for students, where you can find comprehensive information about completing studies at LUT University.
- Excursion/Excu:** A study trip to almost anywhere. The trip may include, for example, company visits, other activities, and hanging out with fellow students.
- Kuutti/Fuksi:** First year student, aka fresher.
- Kylteri:** A senior business student. Freshers become 'kylteris' during the spring fresher baptism in the warm embrace of Lake Saimaa.
- LTKY/lytky:** The Student Union of LUT University. The advocate for university students, ensuring that everyone enjoys university life to the fullest
- Moodle:** A virtual learning environment used at the university, where each course has its own page containing all the necessary information for completing the course.
- NESU:** From the words Nordiska Ekonomie Studerandes Union. It connects Nordic business students. In Finland, NESU associations organize events such as sitz parties in various cities.
- Sitz/Sitsit** An academic tableparty where you eat, drink, and sing.

PLACES TO BE

- Slounge:** Lahti students' common living room, located in the Mukkula campus building. The perfect place for meeting fellow students in a relaxed setting.
- Karaoke room:** Karaoke room A124 aka the former studio of Limu-Radio. The room is equipped with Singa's song repertoire and two microphones connected to the room's sound system. You can access the room with your keycard during campus hours.
- Event arena:** A lobby space in the Mukkula building for hanging out, playing games, hosting events and enjoying cafe Lamkooma products.
- Area 26:** Area 26 is our new student event place located at Aleksanterinkatu 26. At the venue, guilds organize all sorts of events such as sitz parties or weekly sauna nights!
- Community space:** A common area with fun little things to do such as jigsaw puzzles or drawing located on the second floor of the Mukkula building. Open during some weekdays specified in eLut. A Student Community Coordinator is always present during the opening hours, and you are welcome to talk to them about issues regarding your studies or life in general
- Kampus park:** A nice park area between Mukkula and Niemi buildings with seating area and a small amphitheatre style seating area. The park is nice for sitting with friends or organising small events.
- Mukkula-building:** The main campus building located at Mukulankatu 19 containing the majority of classrooms, the library, student hangout areas and more.
- Niemi-building:** The other building at Lahti campus located at Niemenkatu 73. It contains other classrooms, Moveo gym areas, FSHS services and some restaurants, not to forget the turtle pond in the center of the building.

APPLY FOR BENEFITS FROM KELA AND SUBMIT A CHANGE OF ADDRESS NOTIFICATION (ONLY FOR FINNISH CITIZENS AND PERMANENT RESIDENTS)

Kela benefits are applied for through OmaKela, and the easiest way to submit a change of address is through the Posti website, which updates the information both to Posti and DVV



PAY THE HIGHER EDUCATION STUDENT'S HEALTHCARE FEE TO KELA

The student healthcare fee is also paid through OmaKela, and it must be paid by November 15, 2026. No separate invoice will be sent to your home or electronically



REGISTER AS PRESENT AND ACTIVATE YOUR LUT CREDENTIALS BEFORE THE FRESHER WEEK

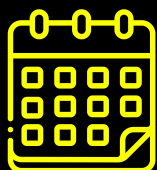

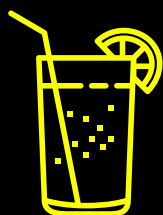

PREPARE CASH AND/OR DOWNLOAD MOBILEPAY AND KIDE.APP

In most student events, the only accepted payment methods are MobilePay or kide.app, so if you haven't downloaded them yet, make sure to do so now. Sometimes you can also pay with cash so make sure you have some on you as well.



IF YOU WANT TO DRINK BEVERAGES - BUY THEM BEFOREHAND



If you think thirst might catch you off guard during Fresher Weeks, it's a good idea to get your starter drinks in advance. The Fresher Weeks' schedule is busy, and everyone else will also be thinking about buying their drinks from the University's Sale, but its shelves will be empty before you know it. Having an emergency frozen pizza on hand wouldn't hurt either.

TRAVELLING

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION - LSL

Buses are often the most convenient way to get around Lahti – though a small downside is that they may run poorly at night.

You can get a bus card with a student discount either through the Waltti-app or a physical travel card at a LSL-service point. The card can be charged with either value or time.

A mobile ticket can also be purchased through an app at the regular adult fare or student discount if the discount has been activated. Singular tickets can also be purchased on the bus with your card at a regular adult fare.



WALTTI-MOBIILI

ADDITIONALLY...



ELECTRIC SCOOTERS

Always a good choice – except when drunk or when there are two on board. You can find two brands of e-scooters, Ryde and Dott through their own apps.



TAXI

In Lahti the most affordable taxi is Bolt or Uber. You can book these through their respective apps. When booking a taxi, it's a good idea to share a ride with fellow students. There are other, more expensive, options such as Lahden aluetaksi or Menevä.



BY WALKING OR BY BIKE

Your legs, your own bike, or Mankeli's city bikes will take you efficiently from one place to another, regardless of the time of day.

CAMPUS'S RESTAURANTS

Food&Co Isku Center –

On the first floor of the Mukkula-campus building, offering breakfast, lunch and cafe options.

Lamkooma – A small cafe near the slounge offering small foods affordably!

Restaurant Shiksha – A restaurant offering Finnish- Indian fusion food next to the auditorium at Mikkulankatu or on the second floor of the Niemenkatu building.

Restaurant Kanttis – A restarurant in the Niemenkatu building, that unfortunately does not offer student priced meals.

In the school cafeterias, students can get a lunch for €3.10 by showing their student card. In Kanttis prices range from 10,50€-13€



DRESS CODE

AKA HOW TO DRESS

SMART CASUAL

Smart Casual is typically worn for events such as company visits and case nights, where a neat appearance is expected. It is often considered similar to Business Casual, making it suitable for office wear.

For a Smart Casual event, you can wear neat jeans with a collared shirt and possibly a relaxed blazer, dress pants with a more informal top, a pencil skirt with a relaxed top, or trousers paired with a stylish blouse and a blazer.



COCKTAIL

Cocktail attire largely depends on the nature of the event. The safest choice is a suit or a knee-length dress, paired with a blazer, bolero, or shawl if needed for shoulder coverage.

For formal occasions, a dark suit, white shirt, and a subtle tie are recommended. In more relaxed settings, a colored shirt and a playful tie can be suitable.

For the Suit Up party during Fresher Weeks, a dress, or smart trousers with a collared shirt, would be a great choice.



HOKINAIT

Hokinait is a commonly used but unofficial dress code in Skinnarila, suited for festive yet casual occasions—despite having nothing to do with ice hockey.

It falls between smart casual and cocktail attire, meaning appropriate outfit choices include neat jeans or a little black dress (which can also be in other colors), or a skirt paired with a slightly more festive top. These can be complemented with a casual blazer or a stylish cardigan (so no hockey jerseys :D).



DRESS CODE

AKA HOW TO DRESS



OVERALLS

The easiest and most common dress code. Until freshers get their overalls, they can simply wear regular clothes instead, whatever suits the theme of the event, the weather and is best for you!

Overalls should not be worn just anywhere—they are only appropriate when the dress code specifically states "overalls." If you're unsure whether overalls are expected for an event, it's safer to wear regular clothes instead.

Overalls can also be combined with themed outfits, for example, when the dress code is "Overalls + Afterski." In this case, you wear your overalls along with other theme-appropriate clothing.

BLACK TIE / WHITE TIE

This dress code is primarily seen in academic annual celebrations (vuju) in the student life.

For these events, attire is either white tie or a full-length evening gown. A white tie ensemble consists of a tailcoat with matching trousers that have a silk stripe on the side, a white tailcoat shirt, a white vest, and a white bow tie. The outfit is completed with cufflinks, patent leather shoes, and suspenders instead of a belt. If desired, a pocket watch can also be worn. As an alternative, a dark suit can replace the tailcoat.

For those opting for a full-length evening gown, the dress should cover the ankles. If the dress has an open back or shoulders, a bolero, stole, or shawl should be worn. The fabric is typically formal and elegant, and statement jewelry is acceptable. A small evening clutch is used as an accessory.

Academic honors, ribbons, and guild sashes can be worn to signify which organization or student association the attendee represents.
